In Havering Culture Survey 2009

- 92% agreed the parks make Havering a nicer place to live.
- 99% agreed that heritage sites make Havering a nicer place to live.
- 89% agreed that the arts help strengthen community spirit.
- 81% agreed that sport helps people to mix.
- 90% agreed that libraries are an important part of the local community.

Parks in Havering Culture Survey 2009.

- 50% want to see more wildlife information in parks.
- 45% want more picnic areas.
- 42% want to have more events in parks.
- 41% want an ecology area in their park.

Heritage in Havering Culture Survey 2009.

- 32% want more investment in heritage.
- 30% want to see improved access to heritage and history events.

Sport in Havering Culture Survey 2009.

- 27% want to see more encouragement and support for talented young sports people.
- 26% want to see more support for healthy lifestyles.
- 25% want improved facilities.

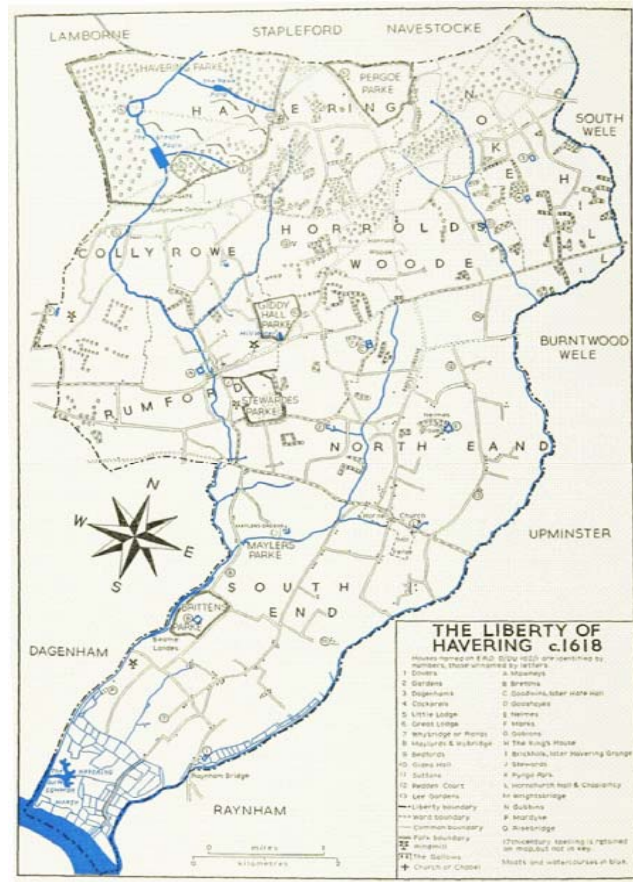
Libraries in Havering Culture Survey 2009.

- 32% want a better/wider choice of books.
- 20% want a better library environment including more reading space.

- 88% agree that they feel fitter and healthier after visiting a Havering park.
- 91% agree that Havering heritage sites make them feel safer in their local area.
- 80% agree that arts activities help them develop and/or learn new skills.
- 91% agree that libraries offer a supportive environment for learning and education.
